. Introduction

In this beautiful story book, Dr Al-'Areefee examines in an admonishing yet entertaining manner the moral decadence that has afflicted Muslims generally and the Muslim woman most especially as she has been the consistent target of the antagonists of Islam who masquerade as her liberators.

He begins with a reminder of the high and exemplary character and sacrifice of the earliest believing women and takes the reader on an ethical story-telling journey to the situation of today's Muslim woman and the contrasting realities between these generations.

The author reminds the Muslim woman of the honorable Queen that she really is by Allah's design if she keeps the moral code prescribed for her beyond needing any demeaning alternative.

The book closes with a charge for the individual to avoid the bandwagon effect in copying modern trends whose popularity generally suggests acceptability but which negate the high moral standards and personal accountability taught by Islam.
